RiverClub Gallery - test-site 5th IABR: Making City



As part of the 5th International Architecture Biennale Rotterdam: MAKING CITY a special test-site was initiated. This test-site, curated by the architectural office ZUS, should put theory to practice; MAKING CITY! For this a certain area was chosen next to the central station of Rotterdam, and current under development.

To exhibit the traveling exhibition MAKING DOUALA within the program of the 5th IABR: MAKING CITY, a temporary gallery was erected within the test-site, The RiverCLUB Gallery.

This former Turkish restaurant and bar, named the RiverClub, was transformed to a gallery by constructing a new shell within it's spatial contours.

Creating this space, eventually hosting 3 different exhibitions over a period of 4 month, felt close to the ambitions and intentions of the triennial Salon Urbain de Douala, represented in the traveling exhibition MAKING DOUALA.

Strategie: transformatie - tentoonstelling / Locatie: Delftsestraat / Partners: LSI, ICU art projects

De begane grond van veel gebouwen op de Test Site Rotterdam bestaat uit geblindeerde ramen, reclame-uitingen en dichte gevels. Daarmee krijgt de openbare ruimte een anoniem karakter en kijkt niemand ernaar om. Op een aantal plekken is de mogelijkheid voor een levendige plint binnen handbereik.

In dit horecapand, dat er al enkele jaren verwaarloosd bij ligt, opent een veelzijdige galerie haar deuren. Nadat de rolluiken zijn geopend en de ruimte van binnen is ingericht voor tentoonstellingen, gaat het pand open voor publiek. Juist op deze hoek met de Schiekade is dat van grote betekenis. Zo ontstaat mede-eigenaarschap van de openbare ruimte die begaanbaar en uitnodigend wordt.

Tijdens de 5^e IABR host de RiverCLUB Gallery diverse tentoonstellingen. Ze gaan van start met Making Douala.

The ground floors of many buildings on the Test Site Rotterdam feature shuttered windows, advertisements and blank facades. As a result, public space is anonymous in character and ignored by everybody. The opportunity to create a lively plinth presents itself in many places.

A flexible gallery space will open its doors inside this building, which previously housed a café but has stood neglected for some years. The building will welcome visitors once the shutters have opened and the space inside is ready to stage exhibitions. That is of great significance, precisely here at the corner with Schiekade. It will foster a sense of shared ownership of public space that becomes accessible and inviting.

The RiverCLUB Gallery will host various exhibitions during the 5th IABR. They start with Making Douala.

Test-Site - 5th IABR: MAKING CITY

Het internationale CuratorTeam werkt sinds 2009 samen met lokale partijen in Rotterdam, São Paulo en Istanbul aan actuele stedelijke opgaven. Open en nieuwe allianties tussen stedenbouwers, wetenschappers, bedrijven, ontwikkelaars en lokale besturen vormen de drijvende kracht achter deze Test Sites. Tijdens de 5e IABR: Making City worden ze gepresenteerd aan publiek. Het doel is om na afloop van de 5e editie de concrete oplossingen daadwerkelijk te realiseren.

De opgave in Rotterdam Central District

In Rotterdam staat net als in de rest van Nederland een groot aantal vierkante meters kantoorruimte leeg. Maar in tegenstelling tot in andere steden bevindt deze leegstand zich vooral in het centrum van de stad. In het gebied tussen Centraal Station, Weena en Pompenburg, oftewel Rotterdam Central District, bevindt zich 100.000 m2 ongebruikte ruimte. Dat is de oppervlakte van zo'n 1200 woningen. De leegstand leidt tot minder levendigheid, minder winkels, minder mensen, minder sfeer, minder lokale economie, minder ontmoetingen: kortom alles wat een stad maakt. Tegelijkertijd is er in de stad dringende behoefte aan kleinere woon- en werkeenheden en verdichting van het programma. De uitdaging is om dit stadsdeel zodanig te transformeren dat het weer een levendig onderdeel van de stad wordt.

Test Site Rotterdam is een project van de IABR en het architectenbureau ZUS. Het is gericht op Rotterdam Central District. De levendigheid moet weer terugkeren in dit stadsdeel. In de huidige markteconomie is het onduidelijk wanneer dit zal gebeuren. Op Test Site Rotterdam wordt geëxperimenteerd met strategieën om het hart van de stad te ontwikkelen via alternatieve vormen van financiering, planningsprocessen en ontwerpinstrumenten. Projecten zijn onder andere de Daktuinen, Park Pompenburg en de Luchtsingel, een crowdfunded voetgangersverbinding van CS naar de Hofbogen. Test Site Rotterdam loopt tot en met 2014 en is één van de platforms waarop de 6e IABR wordt ontwikkeld.



04 Traveling Sound Garden
Lucas Grandin (see: no.#10)

The project "Jardin sonore ambulante" is a prolongation of the first Douala sound garden, created in Bonamouti, for SUD 2010 Douala Cameroon. This is an elevated garden growing at the sound of the water... Different kinds of sound are directly conducted by the plants partition need of water. The water is collected by rainfall, stocked in barrels and offered to the vertical garden trough transparent tubes using a hydrophonic dripping system. Drops of water drip into cans of different sizes, creating notes, producing foods. The "Jardin sonore ambulante" introduces movement to the garden using an instrument of consumption: the Caddy. The caddy container opens a new way to think a garden, a new way to reconsider consumption within the city.

For SUD 2010 flags were placed on the Wouri bridge representing all the natural water sources in the city of Douala.

07 African City Project
Lard Buurman

Buurman focuses on the relation between people and public space. In a series of photos made in cities all over the world, Buurman uses both the static atmosphere of architecture photography, and the dynamics of documentary photography. By reconstructing the image from dozens of different instantaneous exposures from the same perspective, he offers us a new view on the daily aspect.

08 Mo(nu)ments public art in the city of Douala/postcard series

Kamiel Verschuren & Mauro Lugaresi
The large sculpture of Joseph-François Sumegne, La Nouvelle Liberté, was realized in 2007. By now many people in the city of Douala recognize the sculpture as a strong landmark and are able to represent its visual appearance making a true and embraced monument.

09 Ghorfa #7

Younès Rahmoun (see: no.#02)
Younès Rahmoun chose the mangrove as a hosted site of his entitled project Ghorfa #7. "Ghorfa" is a replica of a room under the stairs, which he occupied in the family house in Tétouan (Morocco) and represents (his) a space for artistic thoughts and (his) personal development as an artist. With this installation, the artist invites us to experience what symbolizes or embodies a space of work and meditation. This space of meditation takes all its sense in an environment so fragile as the mangrove and at the same time states the mangrove as a public space.

10/Sound Gardens/Jardins Sonore

11 Lucas Grandin (see: no.#04)

The video and the panels show the development and explain the process related to the different Jardins Sonores, created in Douala, Rotterdam and Sao Tomé. In February 2010 Lucas Grandin started working at his Jardin Sonore in Bonamouti Douala, both a panoramic viewpoint and a dewdrop percussion organ. His work aroused the passionate interest of the inhabitants of the district, creating a place for socializing and contemplation and covering the urban cacophony inside its water walls. The plants are watered drop by drop according to the needs of the suspended garden, which invites the public to contemplate the river Wouri from each of its three levels.

12 Source

Philip Aguirre

Following his residence in Douala in January 2010, Philip Aguirre decided to carry out Source, a work that reinforces the qualities of an amphitheater at the site of a natural spring in Ndogpassi 3, in Douala. The work is still in progress as its funding is not yet completed.

13 Comme deux gouttes d'eau (As Two Drops of Water)

Aliette Cosset/Isabel Forner with Sylvain Ohl

The original project was a large video projection on a water screen in which the 'floating' images of a video creation unfold with fantastic, dreamlike shades. The public projection took place on the riverbanks of the Wouri at Base 11. The artists insist on the non-documentary nature of their approach: their objective is to feed the city dwellers' imaginative world with their film projection.

14 Les mots écrits de New Bell

Hervé Yamguen

Hervé Yamguen invited young rappers of his neighborhood, New Bell Ngangue, to write texts on the relationships of their neighborhood with water. The artist then selected some fragments of these texts to register them in paintings, bas-reliefs, mosaics, neons etc... placed permanently on selected facades in the neighborhood. A concert of rap and a CD were produced for this occasion.

15 Responsibility, the ability to respond
Kamiel Verschuren

In a series of projects Verschuren investigates the public space in cities and how the society functions. The 'gaps' in the roads of Douala represent the current state of society in Douala, a standstill in which both government and people are in a mutual distrust of look and stare, and do not react on the obvious problem of fixing 'the hole'. By marking the 'gaps' this standstill is visualized and made present.

16 Colonne Pascale

Pascale Marthine Tayou

La Colonne Pascale consisted of pots in emaille, which were used in the past by the housewives to protect the food and the drink. La Colonne Pascale is a simple and uncluttered dynamic line rising in the sky, located in the heart of a roundabout in the extremely lively quarter New Bell. His work, often characterized by an accumulation of objects or motives, sends back to the very dense and multi-form context of Cameroon and calls us on the complexity of the being, its multipolarity and its fragility. His work has something of a personal diary.

17 New Walk Ways New Bell

Kamiel Verschuren

With the project New Walk Ways New Bell, Kamiel Verschuren covered approximately 2 kilometers, open-air gutters of the neighborhood New Bell Ngangue. This covering of gutter was realized with long wooden boards on which the artist wrote texts and words bound to water, which were drilled, so allowing the water to infiltrate while avoiding in the solid garbage to penetrate there. New Walk Ways New Bell was realized in association with the local residents. According to the artist, "the project opens for the inhabitants the possibility of mastering and of improving their city dwellers' conditions and invites them to lead spontaneous collective activities as functional as meaningful and beautiful".

18 Responsibility, the ability to respond
Kamiel Verschuren

In a series of projects Verschuren investigates the public space in cities and how the society functions. In the city center Verschuren repainted several abandoned advertising boards and used them to place his statements; "we do not swallow the honey, we chew the bees".

19 Mammy Wata

Ato Malinda

Ato Malinda's project invites us to revisit the myth of Mamy Wata, the aquatic deity said to be found in all coastal areas of the world. A performance on the Wouri River during her residence in Douala resulted in a video that examines the persistence of this myth and its representation. The video film had a public screening and was projected on the facade of a school in New Bell.

20 Inspiration, conversations

Kader Attia

The original work proposed, is a video installation made up of two plasma screens placed side by side in a dark room, representing the profiles of a man and a woman. The two characters blow frantically into an empty plastic bottle. An object of everyday life becomes something else with this act: a sculpture, a horn, a trunk, an extension of our body, a sex organ.

21 Diving in Deep

Ties Ten Bosch

After his first residence to Douala in June, 2010, Ties Ten Bosch decided to settle down as a resident for 2 months (in October-December, 2010) in Ndogpassi 3, to lead the project Diving in Deep, a series of artistic interventions and to create a laboratory opened for the inhabitants to exchange ideas and thoughts with them on the realities of the neighborhood. His project turns around a creative process, where the residents are encouraged to find their own solutions. One of the projects realized in Ndogpassi is a pedestrian footbridge realized in association with his neighbors.

22 Diving in Deep

Ties Ten Bosch

As part of his project Le Plongeur, in which he investigated and visualized the quality of water in the village of Ndogpassi, both from the river and the source, Ten Bosch realized a series of special water bottles containing the water from Ndogpassi to be sold for fund raising.



RESPONSIBILITY, THE ABILITY TO RESPOND —
Within a series of projects named *Responsibility, the ability to respond*, Kamiel Verschuren wants to question the possible roles and activities of the contemporary artist in relation to the complex urban society.

How does one find ones individuality and freedom, ones engagement and responsibility? Is the artist capable to respond to the reality outside him- or herself? What kind of perception, tools and skills are required to be able to respond to ones own thoughts and aims, according to the context?


Since his first visited to Douala in 2007, he tried to question and understand public life in the city through public interventions, actions and projects. How is the relationship between people, as citizens amongst each other, and between the people and their government or (democratic) representation? How does one see ones own responsibility and that towards the community? What does it mean to be a citizen?



NEW WALK WAYS FOR NEW-BELL — One of the most striking and problematic aspects of city life in Douala is infrastructural water management. Besides the general lack of fresh and accessible drinking water, there is the problem of floods. In the townships, often illegally constructed in the lowest areas in the city, the water drainage systems, if they are there at all, are not functioning causing floods after heavy rainfall. This is due to the fact that in many areas the sewers alongside the streets are without coverage and therefore filled with wandering garbage from the streets. This happens because the covers on the open sewers, whether they were made from wooden planks or concrete elements, have often been taken away, burned as fuel wood, or are just damaged by usage, and have not been replaced caused by a lack of maintenance.

Traveling Sound Garden

The project "Jardin sonore ambulant" is a prolongation of the first Douala sound garden, created in Bonamouti, for SUD 2010 Douala Cameroon. This is an elevated garden growing at the sound of the water... Different kinds of sound are directly conducted by the plants partition need of water. The water is collected by rainfall, stocked in barrels and offered to the vertical garden trough transparent tubes using a hydrophonic dripping system. Drops of water drip into cans of different sizes, creating notes, producing foods. The "Jardin sonore ambulant" introduces movement to the garden using an instrument of consumption: the Caddy. The caddy container opens a new way to think a garden, a new way to reconsider consumption within the city.

Sound Gardens/Jardins Sonore

The video and the pannels show the development and explain the proces realted to the different Jardins Sonores, created in Douala, Rotterdam and Sao Tomé. In February 2010 Lucas Grandin started working at his Jardin Sonore in Bonamouti Douala, both a panoramic viewpoint and a dewdrop percussion organ. His work aroused the passionate interest of the inhabitants of the district, creating a place for socializing and contemplation and covering the urban cacophony inside its water walls. The plants are watered drop by drop according to the needs of the suspended garden, which invites the public to contemplate the river Wouri from each of its three levels.

By marking the 'gaps' this standstill is visualized and made present.

La Colonne Pascale consisted of pots in emaille, which were used in the past by the housewives to protect the food and the drink. La Colonne Pascale is a simple and uncluttered dynamic line rising in the sky, located in the heart of a roundabout in the extremely lively quarter New Bell. His work, often characterized by an accumulation of objects or motives, sends back to the very dense and multi-form context of Cameroon and calls us on the complexity of the being, its multipolarity and its fragility. His work has something of a personal diary.



After his first residence to Douala in June, 2010, Ties Ten Bosch decided to settle down as a resident for 2 months (in October-December, 2010) in Ndogpassi 3, to lead the project Diving in Deep, a series of artistic interventions and to create a laboratory opened for the inhabitants to exchange ideas and thoughts with them on the realities of the neighborhood. His project turns around a creative process, where the residents are encouraged to find their own solutions. One of the projects realized in Ndogpassi is a pedestrian footbridge realized in association with his neighbors.







M Comme deux gouttes d'eau - Aliette Cosset/Isabel Forner avec Sylvain Ohl Pendant le SUD2010, ce projet a pris la forme d'un écran d'eau sur lequel défilent, par système de rétro-projection, les images 'flottantes' d'une création vidéo aux tonalités oniriques et merveilleuses. La projection a eu lieu sur les Berges du fleuve Wouri.
